

PACIFIC MONTESSORI SOCIETY - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As you know, one of our top priorities at Selkirk Montessori is to deliver a quality education in a cost-efficient manner. Board members are also mindful of the significant contribution made by parents and, accordingly, we seek to keep fee increases to a minimum.

At a meeting immediately following the AGM in November, the directors approved tuition increases of \$300 for Preschool/ Kindergarten and 6% for Elementary and Middle school programs for 2025–2026. The increase in tuitions was approved specifically to continue to support our incredible staff, who are the heart and soul of Selkirk Montessori. In particular, we want to assure our dedicated educators that the directors are committed to continuing to improve their salaries given the contract agreement in the public system last year.

This has resulted in the following fee adjustments:

* Full Day Preschool: \$13,480

* Full Day Kindergarten: \$11,534

* Elementary/Middle: \$11,486

The Family Statement of Commitment, which you sign each year, is still in force. We need the school, parents and child to work together to develop a healthy respect for the common expectations of the school and to employ the resources deemed necessary by the staff for the success of the child.

Waitlisted Children

We will be in touch with families on the waitlist by mid to late February. Please be patient...but don't hesitate to contact us if you are anxious! We are always happy to hear from parents that they are still keen to get their child(ren) enrolled.

Not Returning

The decision to move a child from one school to another is never an easy one; however, should you decide not to return to Selkirk for the 2025–2026 school year, we'll be sorry to see you go! We ask that you inform us as soon as possible. It has been our experience that children become confused when they are told they are making a move. They wonder, "Is Selkirk still my school? Is there any reason to keep working hard here? Do I still have to follow the rules of the school?" We want to ensure that your child's experience at Selkirk is a positive one, right down to their last day of school. It's a fact of life that some of you will be leaving. Come talk to us about making the transition an easy one for your child, for their teachers and for the school community as a whole.


