In honour of Pride Month, we have created a Statement of Commitment to SOGI Best Practices for our school. Our school has always been a very inclusive, welcoming and safe space, and now it's time to reflect our practice on paper!

Selkirk Montessori School Statement of Commitment to SOGI Best Practices

The Pacific Montessori Society upholds its commitment to providing a safe and supportive environment for all members of our school community, including those who identify as transgender and/or gender non-conforming. Our Board of Directors stands firm in advocating for the rights of every student and staff member to learn and work without fear of discrimination or harassment, and we pledge to actively promote strategies and guidelines that ensure the inclusion, belonging, and respect of all students regardless of gender identity or sexual orientation.

To achieve this commitment, we outline the following principles and actions:

Leadership: Our Board will lead by example in fostering inclusion and enabling the free expression of gender identity among students and staff. Discriminatory actions or complaints will be promptly addressed through established policy and procedures, with a commitment to treating gender-based discrimination with the same diligence as any other form of discrimination.

Learning Resources: We are dedicated to providing inclusive educational resources that respect diverse gender identities and expressions, and a variety of family compositions. Materials that represent all students sponsor a sense of belonging for all students and staff.

Student Support: Our school is committed to providing support tailored to the needs of transgender and gender non-conforming students and staff. We will continue to support the clubs focused on allyship.

Communications: We will ensure that all communications to students, staff, parents, guardians, and the community recognize and respect the diversity of gender identities, expressions, and families present within our school community.

Student Information and Privacy: All students and staff have the right to privacy and to openly discuss and express their gender identity and/or expression as they choose.

Sex-Segregated Activities: We are committed to reducing the segregation of students based on sex and/or gender to encourage the full inclusion of transgender and gender non -conforming students.

Accessibility: Our school recognizes students' rights to freely access single occupant gender- neutral bathroom facilities.

Dress: Students and staff have the right to dress in a manner consistent with their gender identity or expression.

In accordance with this commitment, 'sexual or gender minority' or LGBTQ+ persons encompass a range of identities including, but not limited to, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, transsexual, two-spirit,

intersex, queer, or questioning persons, as well as those with immediate family members who identify as such.

Furthermore, 'gender nonconforming' refers to individuals, particularly children, whose expression of gender differs from societal expectations based on their assigned sex at birth. 'Trans' or 'transgender' individuals include those whose gender identity and/or expression differs from their assigned sex at birth, with some choosing to undergo medical or social transition.

Through these commitments and definitions, we strive to create an environment where every member of our school community feels valued, respected, and supported in their authentic expression of self.

Feeding Futures

Dear Selkirk Families,

Living in Victoria comes with so many blessings of nature and community. We feel very fortunate that you have continued to choose Selkirk Montessori for you child. We appreciate the trust and the sacrifice you make for education and the investment in the whole child's development

We also know that, for different families at different times, expenses can become overwhelming. We understand that the inflation rates have left some families with deficits in their budgets that could not have been anticipated and are leaving them with tough decisions, including in relation to feeding their families. Earlier in the year, the province provided a one time Feeding Futures grant intended to be disbursed through the school to support families struggling with the rising cost of food and at risk of food insecurity.

With the help of additional donations from families and staff, and some left over funds from Feeding Futures, we have more gift cards to share at this time.

If you are a family requiring access to these funds, please do not be shy about letting us know. We will ensure you get any financial support there is available. You can feel confident that there is no judgement – people's circumstances change as our lives evolve – and the utmost confidentiality will be maintained.

Please email erin@selkirkmontessori.ca and we will work on getting grocery cards to families as soon as we know how many are in need.

This funding is intended for <u>families</u> with students <u>currently enrolled in the school at risk of food insecurity, including staff</u>. If you are a staff member whose children have moved into high school, their school will have received a similar grant and we encourage you to reach out to your child's school for similar support.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out. Asking for help takes courage and our school is a community. This is a safe place to accept support.
