This is a friendly reminder that appropriate attire is an important part of each student having a fulfilling and successful day.

What is appropriate attire, you ask? Well, that is the same question a few students ask me every year. And every year we talk about what they need to fully participate in school each day. Making clothing choices that enable participation and engagement is the ultimate practical life activity!

Here are some of the questions students usually come up with for themselves:

- Can I safely run and jump and roll in the gym in these clothes (especially comfortable and supportive shoes)?
- 2. Can I play my instruments and work with materials?
- 3. Am I comfortable sitting on the carpet for lengths of time?
- 4. Can I stay warm and dry outside if the weather changes?
- 5. Can I do all these things without constantly tugging at and adjusting my clothes for comfort, length and position?


# From the Academic Head (cont'd)

A couple years ago, the leadership class delved into this issue and this is the summary statement they came up with about clothing and our reactions to it. "As a student or staff member at school, appropriate clothing should not restrict movement of learning, not be distracting to yourself, and be respectful to both yourself and your peers." These Montessori kids always make me proud of their straightforward and respectful approach to seemingly complicated issues.

# In Memoriam—George Fletcher

A Tribute to George Fletcher who passed away on the 25<sup>th</sup> of March, 2023.



George (better known as "Fletch") was associated with the school since September, 1981 when his and Faye's daughter, aged four, became a student at the Pacific Montessori School at Oaklands.

He became an active, participating parent throughout his daughter's eight years there, with Kris graduating from Grade Seven in 1989. Like so many parents following that mid-eighties foyer/library fire, Fletch really pitched-in to help the school get going again.

He remained as advisor on the school's Ways and Means Committee for years to follow and helped to co-ordinate the various venues and activities structured to raise additional funds for the school.

In June, 2007, Fletch joined the Board of the Karen L. Colussi Foundation where he acted as Secretary.

In addition to this, his experience as a mortgage broker proved invaluable in the negotiations for renewal of the school mortgage. He was always such a positive presence on the Board, cheerful yet efficient and ever caring of the school which meant so much to his family. He will be greatly missed.

Our thoughts are with his wife Faye, his daughter Kris, Rob and family.

### **Bidding Owl & How it Works:**

For the second year, Selkirk Montessori School is taking its largest fundraiser online! Bidding Owl is easy to use and allows you to view items before bidding officially opens on the night of the event! It also allows anyone who can't attend in person to still participate and support our cause in raising funds for our school community. Register:

- View the Biddingowl.com website. Click on "Bidder Sign-In" and create an account.
- Please maintain your Username and Password in a safe place. You will need this to log in and participate in the silent auction.
- Click the Featured Auctions Tab and search for Selkirk Montessori School, 80's Prom Auction.
- Once you are on our auction site, you will see a drop-down tab for the Catalogue, by category. We will be updating the system daily with new items, so check often!
- Bidding will open at 6pm on May 13<sup>th</sup>, the night of the event!
- This online system will auto-bid for you! You can select a maximum amount you'd like to bid on an item, and it will continue to bid in small increments so you can browse for something else.
- Bidders receive a text message when they are outbid, and when they have won.
- You can see what you have purchased in your shopping cart and pay by cash, cheque, or credit card in the cash room.

Remember to have your phone or tablet fully charged before the event!


### Community Education Night - in person on May 17

# Counsellor's Corner



One of my favourite things about the Montessori philosophy is the emphasis placed on mentorship and peer support.

For example, in the classroom one might see a student offer a mini review lesson on a math material to a classmate, or another student help their friend practise for their spelling test. This type of peer support also occurs in social situations where students naturally help one another with conflicts or personal challenges.

To help meet this need and desire to support others, the Peer Helper volunteer program has been introduced to the Gr. 5 and 6 students.

Back in February, students interested in becoming Peer Helpers were invited to complete an application form and then attend four training sessions to prepare them to help the younger grades at recess.

The trainings covered topics such as physical safety, promoting connection and inclusion, and problem solving. 24 students from the Cormorant and Sea Star classes have successfully completed the Peer Helper training and have been assigned to support the gr. 1-4 students at recess once per week.

The Peer Helpers have been proudly wearing their bright orange safety vests while on duty so that their younger peers can easily spot them.
