Montessori educators are highly trained in observation as a frm of assessment to guide their planning. It allows us to understand how the different aspects of each child are contributing to successes, emerging interests, passions, and challenges. It allows us to know when to let a child sit with discomfort and when to encourage, guide, or intervene. Observation is also an excellent tool for parents who are prone to jumping in (that's me!) or tend to hold back with uncertainty.

With Child Hosted Visits complete for the year, there is another opportunity to practice the art of observation. These visits take place in November for Grades 1-8 and January for Preschool and Kindergarten. Keep an eye on your emails to sign up through PTCFast. We encourage you to make time in your busy schedules to come see how your curious, creative, growing children are spending their days. The pride that students demonstrate when a parent arrives for an observation is always evident. It is a pride in one's family, a pride in the work they are doing, and a pride in the importance one's parent has placed on their education and in sharing that experience. Your time is the most valuable gift you can give your child.

When observing, try your best not to disrupt your child from your seat; limit interactions to a quiet wave and encouraging smile. This way, you can truly see how they manage their work cycle. Hopefully those of you with younger children will be fortunate enough to see something other than a visit to the snack table, always the activity my children chose when their parents visited. Feel free to bring a notebook to jot down thoughts and questions should any arise. You may share these with the teachers at your upcoming 3-Way Conferences scheduled for November 20th. There will be a separate email for you to sign up for these in person visits, as well. We look forward to seeing you at both events.
